



The Birmingham & District Dobermann Club, The Midland Dobermann Club, The North of England Dobermann Club, The South East of England Dobermann Club, The South West Dobermann Club & The Scottish Dobermann Club maintain the judging lists A1, A3, B & C.

Applications for the judging lists or progression to another list must be made to any one of the above Clubs' Secretaries, details below. The applicant should send 6 (six) copies or email a copy of the fully completed questionnaire and appropriate certificates. At the judges sub-committee meeting, voting on the application will take place and those achieving approval will be added to the relevant list. Applications will only be accepted on the correct form and applications that do not meet criteria will be returned by the Club Secretary. Shaded areas and ghost figures on each application form indicate that this is a minimum requirement. Applicants are required to sign a declaration that they have read and understood the Kennel Club Code of Best Practice for Judges and the Dobermann Breed Standard and that they will judge in accordance with it.

From January 1st 2017, to judge 5 (five) or more classes you MUST be on the relevant Breed Club (A1, A3 or B) Judges List. Those judges not appearing on the B List may judge up to 4 (four) classes of the breed at open or non-CC championship shows with the proviso that one of these classes is a puppy class.

Those judges listed as having either a Breed Credit Certificate for Dobermanns under the KC Judges Development Programme or those approved to judge Best In Show at General Championship Shows and 'Policy Judges' in the Working Group shall, upon submission of a fully completed application form, be automatically entitled to inclusion of the Non-Breed Specialist 'B' list.

The Clubs reserve the right to review and/or amend the lists as is deemed necessary. We are not required to include all Judges who qualify under this criteria, nor are we required to give any reasons for exclusion. Judges will be notified in writing of any changes to their status. Inclusion on a Judges list in one year does not automatically ensure subsequent inclusion.

A1 LIST

Contains the names of the persons whom the six breed clubs would support and whom have previously been approved by The Kennel Club to award CC's in the breed and have completed their first appointment. The persons named on this list must have fulfilled the requirements of A3 list.

A3 LIST

Contains the names of the persons who, as yet, have not been approved by The Kennel Club and who are considered by the six breed clubs to have sufficient knowledge of the Dobermann and experience of judging the breed to be recommended and supported to award CC's. These persons may be assessed by The Kennel Club when judging their first appointment.

B LIST

Contains the names of the persons considered by the six breed clubs to have sufficient knowledge and experience of the Dobermann to be supported to judge the breed at Open shows to comply with KC guidelines.

C LIST

Contains the names of the persons considered by the six breed clubs to have sufficient knowledge and experience of the Dobermann to be supported to judge the breed at General Canine Societies Limited and Open Shows.

OVERSEAS JUDGES

Persons who are considered by the six breed clubs to have sufficient knowledge and judging experience of the Dobermann in their own country to be recommended and supported by the six breed clubs to award CC's to comply with KC guidelines.



JUDGES CRITERIA

A1 LIST

For people who have previously been approved by The Kennel Club to award CC's in the breed, have completed their first appointment and have the support of the six breed clubs. The persons named on this list must have fulfilled the requirements of A3 list.

A3 - BREED SPECIALIST

1. To have a minimum of 7 (seven) years judging experience in the breed and have the support of the six breed clubs.
2. To have judged one (1) Dobermann Breed Club Show.
3. To have judged the breed at 10 (ten) all breed Open or Championship Shows without CC's with an adequate geographical spread.
4. To have judged a minimum of 50 (fifty) classes of Dobermanns at all breed Open or Championship Shows without CC's.
5. To have judged a minimum of 160 (one hundred and sixty) dogs.
6. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures.
7. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on Conformation & Movement.
8. To have attended a Points of the Dog Assessment conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment.
9. To have attended at least 1 (one) Dobermann breed specific educational seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice.
10. To have attended a Dobermann breed specific judging competence assessment run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed the assessment test.
11. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 (three) dogs when they obtained their first entry in The Kennel Club Stud Book (Save in exceptional circumstances).
12. To have stewarded at 12 (twelve) Shows.

A3 - NON-BREED SPECIALIST

1. To have a minimum of 7 (seven) years judging experience in any one breed (to include 5 (five) years in this breed) and have the support of the six breed clubs.
2. To have judged 1 (one) Dobermann Breed Club Open Show.
3. To have judged the breed at 12 (twelve) all breed Open or Championship Shows without CC's with an adequate geographical spread.
4. To have judged a minimum of 50 (fifty) classes of Dobermanns at all breed Open or Championship Shows without CC's.
5. To have judged 175 (one hundred and seventy five) dogs in this breed.
6. To have awarded CC's in at least 1 (one) other breed.
7. To have attended at least 1 (one) Dobermann breed specific educational seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice.
8. To have attended a Dobermann breed specific judging competence assessment run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed the assessment test.
9. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 (three) dogs of any breed when they obtained their first entry in The Kennel Club Stud Book (Save in exceptional circumstances).

OVERSEAS JUDGES

Must be approved by the governing body of the country in which they are domiciled to award CC's (or the equivalent) in Dobermanns and complete the overseas questionnaire to the satisfaction of the six breed clubs.

B LIST – BREED SPECIALIST

1. To have 5 (five) years experience owning and exhibiting in this breed and have the support of the six breed clubs.
2. To have judged 20 (twenty) classes of Dobermanns at all breed Open or Championship Shows without CC's.
3. To have judged a minimum of 60 (sixty) dogs of this breed.
4. To have attended at least 1 (one) Dobermann breed specific educational seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice.

B LIST – NON-BREED SPECIALIST

1. To have a minimum of 5 (five) years judging experience in any one breed and have the support of the six breed clubs.
2. To have judged 24 (twenty four) classes of Dobermanns at all breed Open or Championship Shows without CC's.
3. To have judged 75 (seventy five) dogs of this breed.

C LIST – BREED SPECIALIST

1. For aspiring judges who have shown an interest in the breed and have the support of the six breed clubs.
2. To have 2 (two) years experience owning and exhibiting in this breed

C LIST – NON-BREED SPECIALIST

1. For aspiring judges who have shown an interest in the breed and have the support of the six breed clubs.
2. To have 2 (two) years judging experience in any one breed.
